

## Progression of Knowledge and Skills - Art

We believe that Art it is a vital part of the education of all children. We aim for children to feel that their creations are celebrated and appreciated. We believe that this will help each child to feel the freedom to express their individualities through their art and to have them celebrated and see that they are valued though display in school. The child's use and understanding of the visual language of art is developed by effective teaching and by a considered sequence of experiences. We aim to provide an art curriculum which will enable each child to reach their full potential in learning in art, through investigating and making, through research and the development of skills and through their evaluation of their own art and that made by others. We aim for our art curriculum to support and nurture positive self-image and esteem as well as a respect for the individualities of others and of themselves.

In planning and guiding what children learn, practitioners must reflect on the different rates at which children are developing and adjust their practice appropriately. The three Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning are: **playing and exploring** - children investigate and experience things, and 'have a go'; **active learning** - children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties, and enjoy achievements; **creating and thinking critically** - children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas, and develop strategies for doing things. In addition, the prime areas of learning (**PSE, CL, PD**) underpin and are an integral part of children's learning in all areas.
