Year 1	Guy Fawkes - bonfire/fireworks/sparklers safety
	Vehicles on land - road safety Vehicles on water - water safety Vehicles and pollution
Year 2	Significant People: Need for hygiene and what can happen if handwashing etc is not done Mary Seacole - not all plants and herbs are medicinal Great Fire of London: Fire safety and safety in the home in the 21 st Century Explorers: Christopher Columbus - water safety
Year 3	Ancient Egypt: Sun safety in hot countries – hats and sun cream Ancient Greece: Olympics – warm ups before exercise and healthy, balanced diets
Year 4	Romans : Safety and hazard awareness on Roman sites e.g. Verulanium Vikings: Sea safety
Year 5	Victorians: Industrial Revolution - increase in pollution and the long term effect on the environment and people's health. Ernest Shackleton: Water cafety and keeping warm in extreme weather

Year group	Equality & Diversity Elements taught
EYFS	Family life - be aware of different family structures
Year 1	Amelia Earhart First woman to fly solo across Atlantic. People thought women should not do this
Year 2	Significant and Inspirational People Mary Seacole had different experiences due to her colour Emily Davidson - rights for women Rosa Parks - civil rights for African-Americans
Year 3	Ancient Greece Women in Ancient Greece were expected to stay away from public spaces, girls educated at home, often married in early teens, couldn't vote, own property Spartan women had more rights than those in Athens. Olympics – only men took part; Paralympics
Year 4	Romans Unfair treatment of Boudicca when she rebelled Nelson Mandela & Apartheid Black people had no rights to say how the country was run; white people took land from black people
Year 5	Victorians Only children from rich families went to school; many children worked from age 5 Civil Rights Movement Racial discrimination made illegal in the US.
Year 6	World War 2 Women were not allowed in the army, navy and air force - housewives or 'women's jobs' Holocaust - anti-Semitism
